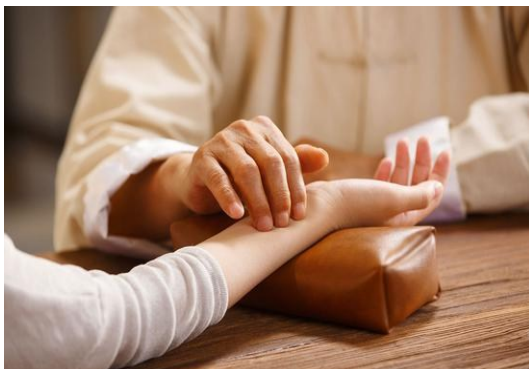

Why Study BHSc Chinese Medicine at NZCCM?

- NZCCM's BHSc degree enables you to be a health professional and register with the Chinese Medicine Council of NZ as a Chinese Medicine practitioner.
- The degree is structured to enable students to become qualified Acupuncturists—a 3-year BHSc major in Acupuncture— or qualified Chinese Medicine practitioners through an additional year of study to gain a 4-year BHSc major in Chinese Medicine (Acupuncture and herbal Medicine).
- The degree is the first programme in New Zealand to be structured based on a Chinese University syllabus. Students will gain not only complete, integrated TCM knowledge and skills, but also an understanding of the latest developments in TCM therapies and techniques.
- The degree provides excellent and rewarding possibilities with over 90% of graduates reporting positive employment outcomes.
- Taking encouragement from past students who have graduated and moved successfully into working in the health sector, the majority of graduates have become ACC-registered treatment providers and are either self-employed in their own acupuncture clinics, or working with established practices.
- Graduates are eligible to register with the Chinese Medicine Council of NZ under the HPCA Act (2003)

Programme Aims

EMPLOYMENT OUTCOMES

- ♣ Self-employment in Traditional Chinese Medicine or Acupuncture Clinics
- ♣ Employment as acupuncturists or Chinese medical herbalists in an established Chinese Medicine Clinic or Multi-disciplinary Complementary Alternative Medicine Clinic
- ♣ Chinese Medicine Practitioner in an established Chinese Medicine Clinic or Multi-disciplinary Complementary Alternative Medicine Clinics
- ♣ Graduates are eligible to become certified Chinese medicine practitioners (acupuncturists) or Chinese herbal medicine practitioners, and can also register as ACC-accredited acupuncture treatment providers.

Students intending to apply for our degree programmes must possess the personal and professional qualities required to become competent and ethical healthcare providers.

Completion of an interview process will enable us to ensure that there is a match between our learners, their employment and future goals, and our programmes.

Primary requirements:

- NCEA L3 and university entrance or equivalent;
- IELTS (Academic) 6.0 or equivalent;
- Or apply for special admission if age of 20 or over.
